



## EQUIPMENT CHECKLIST

Only the official Boy Scouts of America field uniform and accessories are acceptable. This includes Venturing, Varsity, Ship, and Explorer field uniforms. The field uniform will be worn throughout the week, anytime that a scout is outside her/his assigned patrol campsite. Everyone will be in official uniform upon arrival to camp (see first 4 items on the required list). All badges and insignia must be properly placed on the field uniform.

Be prepared for an overnight hike as well as living in camp. At least one pair of shoes must be suitable for hiking. Place your name on all clothing and personal items. Any items that you do not own, please borrow. A hiking backpack or frame should be used for getting gear from the parking lot to the campsite. In addition to the backpack, winter and spring participants may carry one duffel bag not exceeding 48 inches in length. See list of **PROHIBITED ITEMS** below.

### Required – All Sessions

- Full BSA Field Uniform
- NYLT official t-shirt (2 provided at check-in)
- NYLT hat (provided at check-in)
- Boots or Athletic shoes
- Underclothing
- Rain Jacket
- Sleepwear
- Tent, ground cloth
- Cot
- Pillow
- Sleeping Bag, sheets or lightweight blanket
- Hiking Backpack
- Water Bottle
- All Toiletries needed (towel, shampoo, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc...)
- Personal First Aid Kit
- Sun Screen/Lip Balm
- Pen or pencil
- Flashlight
- Work gloves
- Camp Chair

\*See note about medications below

### Recommended – Spring & Winter

- Wicking layered clothing
- Insulated clothing
- Long pants, thicker socks
- Beanie or stocking cap for sleeping
- Cold weather gear (long sleeve shirts, fleece, sweatshirt, etc...)
- Gloves or mittens
- Sleeping bag (zero to 20 degree)
- Blanket

### Recommended – Summer

- Swimming Trunks
- Sunscreen
- Towel

### Overnighter for all courses

- Tent, ground cloth
- Cot or sleeping bag
- Mess Kit

### Prohibited Items

- Electronics (cell phones, games...)
- Open toed shoes
- Tobacco, drugs and alcohol
- No clothing with inappropriate images or messages

**NOTE: All prescription medications in original prescribed containers must be turned into the Health Officer at check-in. Scouts see the medical officer whenever they need medication. No over the counter medications allowed, these are available as needed through the Health Officer.**
